Time expressions: yesterday, two days ago, last year (week, month, term, century, etc.), in 1961

Regular Verbs	Negative form	Questions	Short answers
start - started	didn't start	Did it start ?	Yes, it did ./No, it didn't .
like - liked	didn't like	Did she like..... ?	Yes, she did ./No, she didn't .
try - tried	didn't try	Did he try..... ?	Yes, he did ./No, he didn't .
watch - watched	didn't watch	Did you watch...?	Yes, I did ./No, I didn't .
stop - stopped	didn't stop	Did they stop.....?	Yes, they did ./No, they didn't .

 - She **liked** that athlete's performance yesterday.
 - The opening ceremony of the 2012 Summer Olympics **started** on Friday, 27 July in London.
 - They **didn't watch** two football matches on TV three days ago.
 - She **didn't like** that athlete's performance last week.
 - The opening ceremony **didn't start** on Saturday.

- **Did they watch** two football matches on TV two days ago? - Yes, they **did**.
 - **Did she like** that athlete's performance last week? - No, she **didn't**.
 - **Did the opening ceremony start** on Friday? - Yes, it **did**.

- They **didn't watch** two football matches on TV three days ago.
 - She **didn't like** that athlete's performance last week.
 - The opening ceremony **didn't start** on Saturday.
-
- **Did they watch** two football matches on TV two days ago? - Yes, they **did**.
 - **Did she like** that athlete's performance last week? - No, she **didn't**.
 - **Did the opening ceremony start** on Friday? - Yes, it **did**.
