Imperative mood is used to express commands or requests as a grammatical mood. These commands or requests force the audience to act a certain way. It also may signal a prohibition or permission.

- **Come** here and **answer** the question!
- **Go** and **make** me a drink!
- Just **eat** the apple if you want!
- **Have** a nice weekend!
